- **Initial CSAP Layout**
 - Working document was provided to the committee for a progress update. There is missing content/references/labels, and is not for public distribution.
 - Nate, Jen, and Dustin preferred project recommendations at the beginning of the planning document.
- **Initial Project Recommendations:**
 - Project staff will evaluate recommendations with the matrix and then provide to the committee for review and feedback.
 - Committee members in attendance agreed that projects should be organized with the 3 Project Categories after matrix evaluation.
 - Corridor/Area Projects (Haines Highway and Major Routes), 3. Rumble Strip Installation for Roadway Departure Reduction (Haines Highway) : Nate and Dustin shared concerns about rumble strips in the shoulder without any widening work for bicycle traffic.
 - Clarification was requested for Systemic/Area-Wide Safety Projects, 9. Assessment of Street Lighting Improvements: Clarify if this is for motorists, pedestrians cyclists, wildlife, school zone, commercial district, etc.

ACTION ITEMS:**Leadership Commitment and Goal Setting**

A high-ranking official and/or governing body in the jurisdiction publicly committed to an eventual goal of zero roadway fatalities and serious injuries, including setting a target date.

- Approval and recommendation by the HB Planning commission for adoption of the plan.
- Resolutions from CIA and CIV supporting the plan.
- Adoption of the plan by the HB Assembly.

Planning Structure

Establish a committee, task force, implementation group, or similar body charged with the plan's development, implementation and monitoring.

- Establishment of SS4A Steering Committee.

Safety Analysis

Analysis of existing conditions and historical trends to provide a baseline level of crashes involving fatalities and serious injuries.

- Safety Analysis Memo (Historically available/public data)
- Safety Survey (community provided data)

Engagement and Collaboration

Engage with the public and relevant stakeholders, including the private sector and community groups. Coordination with inter- and intra-governmental cooperation and collaboration.

 - Additional recommendations will be made based on data outside of the safety analysis data (road closure data, wildlife data, code review, plan review, etc.)
